Report to the 2020 Annual General Meeting

Two exciting events took place in the 2019-20 season. The first was a Day of Deeper Understanding; the second, our third shortened Three-Day Cursillo weekend.

The Day of Deeper Understanding (DoDU) is oriented to those who have attended a Cursillo weekend in the past few years, and desire to learn more about the Cursillo Movement.

Our opening Prayer and Praise Ultreya, held on Friday, September 27th, at 7 p.m. was immediately followed by a short OACM Annual General Meeting and refreshments.

On Saturday, Sept. 28, we enjoyed five talks, small group discussion, and fellowship. Our keynote speaker was the Rt Rev. Peter Coffin, a long-time Cursillista, who spoke about "Cursillo in the church and the diocese." Admitting that he was initially skeptical about Cursillo, Bishop Peter proclaimed his Cursillo weekend to have been a seminal experience is his early priesthood and one he heartily recommends. Other topics on which talks were followed by table discussion included The Fourth Day, The Flow of the Cursillo Weekend, and Candidate Sponsorship. Talks were interspersed with music arranged by Graham Jacques, OACM Musica.

All who attended proclaimed it a wonderful event. Many thanks went out to Henry Troup, former OACM Secretariat member, who organized the DoDU.

The **Women's 128th Ottawa Anglican Cursillo Weekend** took place from November 22-24, 2019 with the theme from Matthew 6, "**Do not worry about your life; consider the lilies.**"

I was privileged and humbled to be the Lay Rector of the weekend which had 22 team members from 15 parishes and 19 candidates from 9 parishes spread across the diocese. This was the third shortened weekend and the second shortened women's weekend. Thanks to the successes of the 127th women's weekend and the flexibility and experience of the back table (particularly Sharon Fleming, 1st Detail), we were able to refine the schedule for the benefit of all involved. I am confident in recommending the model for the upcoming 130th women's weekend in November 2021.
